

## SYDNEY LAW SCHOOL - CHALLIS LECTURER PROVISIONS 2013

(1) The Faculty of Law has traditionally recommended the conferral on eminent individuals of the title of Challis Lecturer, which is awarded by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Dean.

- (2) These provisions set out the bases on which such recommendations will be made.
- (3) The title of Challis Lecturer is exclusive and there will be no more than five (5) Challis Lecturers at one time.
- (4) The title:
  - (a) will only be conferred on the most distinguished and long standing lecturers in foundation or key areas of the law; and
  - (b) in each case will identify the area of law in relation to which it is conferred: for example, *Challis Lecturer in Equity*.
- (5) There will be no fixed term for which the title is awarded. Its continuation will depend on the incumbent continuing, in the opinion of the Dean and the Vice-Chancellor, to make a contribution to either or both of teaching and research in the relevant area of law.
- (6) The conditions and privileges attached to the title of Challis Lecturer will be the general conditions and privileges of honorary titles at the University.

- (7) Any member of the Faculty may nominate an individual for award of the title Challis Lecturer by submitting a written proposal to the Dean. If approved, the Dean may then recommend to the Vice Chancellor that the title be awarded.
- (8) Once the Vice Chancellor has determined to award the title, the Dean will ensure that the lecturer is informed of the conferral of the title and that relevant form is completed and sent to the HR Service Centre.
